
Evaluating your Vision

There are various different ways to write and evaluate your Theologically Rooted Christian Vision, this model is not the definitive 'correct' way, it is a model which you may find helpful, and it can be especially useful in evaluating your vision.

One way you might use this model to write a vision statement: us the prompts below to consider 'Who are we'. What are the shared values that define who you are as a school, what does flourishing look like in your school? How does Theology speak in this? As a result of this, when people leave your school, how do they go out into the world?

One way you might use this model to evaluate an existing vision statement: place your school vision in the center of the sheet, use 3 different coloured highlighters to identify where your vision talks about what happens in your school, where your vision talks about God, and where your vision talks about how you are preparing children for the world beyond school. Is there any area that you think could be strengthened?
